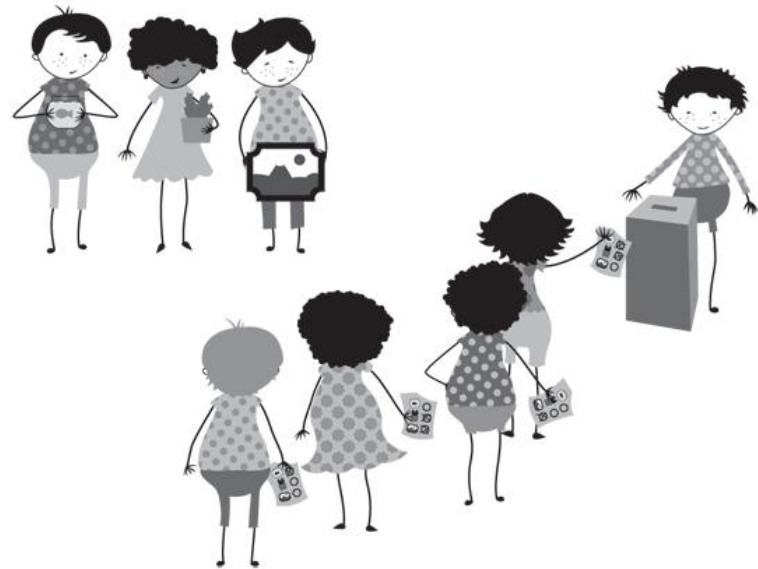
Democracy

- *Greek term "rule of the people", "people" and "power"*



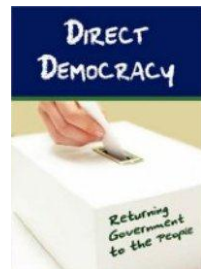

Types of Democracy

- **Oligarchy or Aristocracy** is power held by one, as in a Monarchy, or where power is held by a small number of individuals
- **Direct Democracy** = in which citizens have direct and active participation in the decision making of the government.
- **Representative Democracy** = citizens remain the sovereign power but political power is exercised indirectly through elected representatives

Society

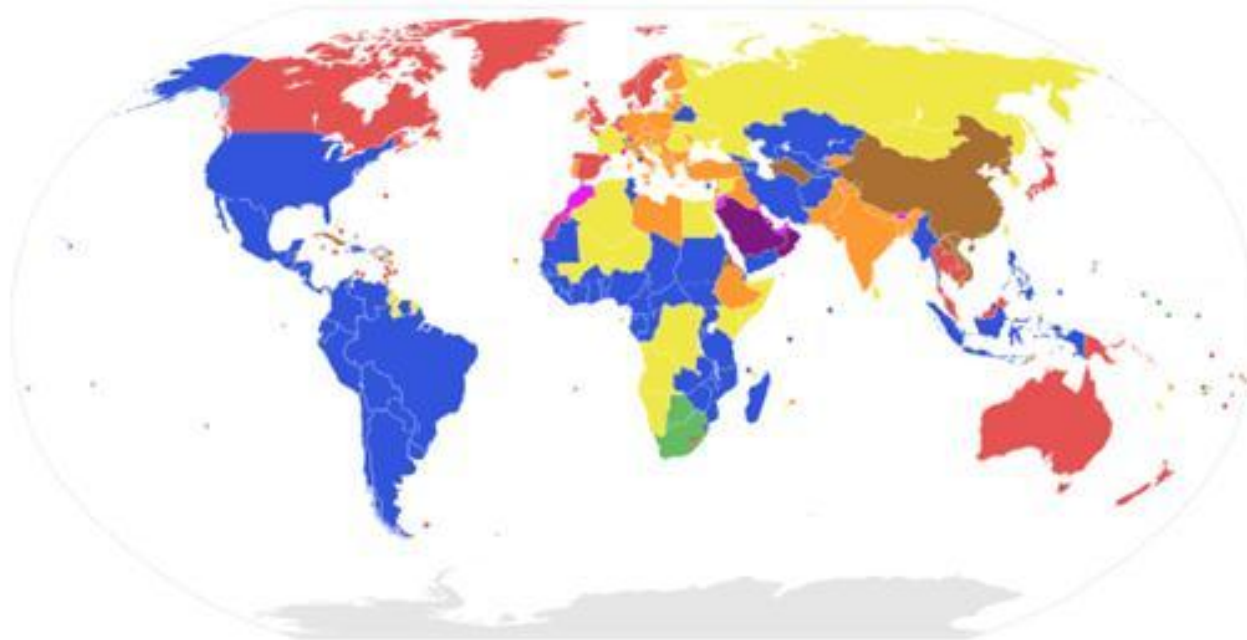
- **A society**= group of sharing the same geographical or virtual territory, subject to the same political authority and dominant cultural expectations.











 Presidential republics	 Semi-presidential republics
 Parliamentary republics	 Single-party republics
 Parliamentary constitutional monarchies	 Absolute monarchies
 Military dictatorships	 Parliamentary constitutional monarchies in which the monarch personally exercises power
 Republics with an executive president dependent on a parliament	 Countries which do not fit any of the above systems
