Right to life

- The concept is to debate on the issues of euthanasia, capital punishment, abortion, self defense and war.



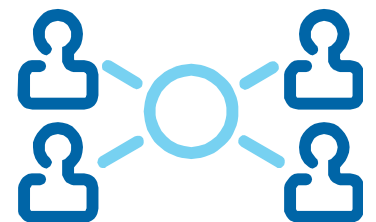
Property

- Is any physical or intangible entity that is owned by a person or jointly by a group of people or a legal entity like a corporation.
- Depending on the owner of property, he has the right to **consume**, **sell**, **rent**, **mortgage**, **transfer**, **exchange**, **destroy it**, or to **exclude others** from doing these things.



Liberty

- Ability of individuals to do whatever they want, to have control of their actions, but they need to be responsible of it.
- Political freedom is the right of self-determination, as an expression of the will of the individual, concerning what type of social organization wishes to have, develop or belong.
