Imposition

• Anarchy is a peaceful condition in which the state (political government) does not exist and power is largely decentralized.

Anarchies

- To anarchists, the government should not be able to force us to follow their rules.





- Anarchy is a Greek word that means "no ruler".
- Contrary to popular sentiment, an anarchist is not a person who wants chaos and destruction.





- Anti Democracy is usually defined by government types such as dictatorship which completely removes the whole idea of democracy in the country.
- Dictatorship is characterized by having 1 supreme leader who controls both the economy and politics in the country.

Dictatorship
